




The Trestleboard is the name for the newsletter of Freemasons. A Trestleboard was a tool utilized by Operative Master Masons to detail the daily work of the Craftsman. The plans and designs for the work were scratched or carved into or drawn on the surface of the board. The earliest Trestleboard (or more accurately Tracing Board), was thought to have been a wooden board covered in wax. The designs were cut or carved into the wax. The wax could be scraped off and renewed as needed. A modern-day Trestleboard in Operative vocations is the Blueprint.

Brothers, for the last couple of months, we've been reviewing the relationship between Freemasonry and the American Civil War. Before that, we looked at the connections between Masonry and the American Revolution. Now, I'd like to steer us into an exploration of the Craft and faith. Faith, specifically Christianity, is vital to my life and primarily WHY I joined Masonry. My Lord and Savior Jesus Christ did not come to be served, but to serve... (Mat 20:28, Mar 10:45). When asked by the Pharisees to identify the greatest commandment, Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself" Matt 22:36, 37 and 39). I strive to be like Him, and thus Masonry gives me a platform to demonstrate love for others through acts of service.

Freemasonry isn't a religion and is not a substitute for it. It also doesn't prescribe any particular religious belief. It only requires that a man believe in a Supreme Being in order that the obligations he makes during his degrees are binding. While in California and most Masonic Lodges the Holy Bible is considered the first of the three great lights of Masonry. In other jurisdictions it is considered the "Volume of Sacred Law." If a non-Christian man were to be initiated, we would place his religion's Volume of Sacred Law next to the Bible out of respect. So, over the next several months, I'd like to look at Masonic connections to the major faiths beginning with Christianity.

The connections between Freemasonry and the Bible are intricate and multifaceted, as Freemasonry draws inspiration from various religious and philosophical traditions, including Christianity. Here are some key connections between Freemasonry and the Bible:

- 1. Biblical References: Freemasonry incorporates numerous references to biblical stories, figures, and symbols into its rituals and ceremonies. For example, the building of Solomon's Temple is a central theme, symbolizing the pursuit of wisdom, knowledge, and spiritual enlightenment.
- 2. The Volume of Sacred Law (VSL): As mentioned earlier, Freemasonry requires its members to take oaths on a book considered sacred to them, which could be the Bible for Christian Freemasons. The Bible is often referred to as the "Volume of Sacred Law" (VSL), emphasizing its importance as a source of moral and spiritual guidance within Freemasonry.
- 3. Moral and Ethical Teachings: Freemasonry promotes moral and ethical teachings that are often aligned with the principles espoused in the Bible, such as brotherly love, charity, truth, and the pursuit of virtue. Many Masonic rituals and ceremonies incorporate biblical passages to illustrate these moral lessons.
- 4. Symbolism: The Bible is rich in symbolism, and Freemasonry likewise utilizes symbols to convey its teachings. Symbols such as the square, compass, trowel, and the letter "G" are commonly found in both Masonic and biblical contexts, representing concepts like morality, duty, and divine guidance.
- 5. Influence of Christian Morality: As indicated earlier, while Freemasonry is open to individuals of all religious backgrounds, many of its members have been Christians, and Christian morality has undoubtedly influenced Masonic teachings and rituals. This influence can be seen in the emphasis on virtues such as faith, hope, and charity, which are central to Christian ethics.
- 6. Ceremonies and Rituals: Freemasonry incorporates ceremonial elements that may echo biblical narratives or symbolism. For instance, the initiation ritual often involves symbolic journeys and moral instruction, similar to the moral lessons conveyed through biblical stories.
- 7. Philosophical Connections: Some Masonic teachings and symbols have parallels with biblical themes and philosophical concepts found in Christian theology. Concepts such as the search for light, the importance of self-improvement, and the idea of spiritual enlightenment resonate with biblical ideas of seeking truth and salvation.

It's important to recognize that interpretations of the connections between Freemasonry and the Bible may vary among different Masonic jurisdictions and individual Masons. While Freemasonry draws inspiration from biblical teachings and symbolism, it also incorporates elements from other religious traditions and philosophical sources, reflecting its inclusive and ecumenical nature. Next month, we'll dive deeper into Masonry's connection to Christianity.




